Dear Doctor

I see by the Minutes of proceedings in the House that you are at your post as usual. You are no doubt aware that a Movement has been made in Prescott in favour of the separation of Grenville from Leeds, and holy St. Patrick, will most likely, use his influence, I believe, in favour of Repeal. We are all true Britains in this part of the County and go for the Union. We intend to

Public Meetings in the different
Municipalities in, near or Grenville
and get up Petitions to Counter-
act the Prescott Movement, as
soon as we become acquainted
with the prayer of their petition.

We will depend on you to let
us know how the business pro-
gresses so that we may not be
taken by surprise. I do not of
course know your views re-
specting the question of separa-
tion, but I do know, that your
disposition must have changed
if you do not wish to have a
fair expression of public opinion
and that is all we require.

I think that I may
safely say that nine tenths
of the population of South
Gower, Bedford, Kennebec
and Wolford, are opposed
to the separation of the coun-
ties with Prescott the County
Town. We shall forward
you the petitions as soon
as we can get them suf-
ficiently signed, and I am
sure you will have influence
enough to defeat the Repeal
Movements of our Prescott
Clear Grit.
