Mais le conseil municipal de Hastings, gardien de ce dépôt, va le restituer.

**THIS SHIELD**  
was taken from off one of the Gates of QUEBEC  
at the time that a Conquest was made of that CITY  
by His Majesty's Sea and Land Forces  
(in the Memorable Year 1759) under the Command of the Admirals  
SAUNDERS and HOLMES and the Generals  
WOLFE, MONCKTON, TOWNSEND, and MURRAY,  
which latter being Appointed the first British  
GOVERNOR thereof made a present of this TROPHY  
of War to this CORPORATION  
whereof He then was one of the JURATS.
