Gentlemen

At the regular meeting of the Firmens Benevolent Association held in their rooms Central Fire Station Wednesday May 25th the following motion was duly made & carried

Moved by Mr. J. A. Beaulieu and seconded by Capt. P. H. Gibson. That the Fire Committee be asked to pass a motion authorizing our Chief (J. Benoit Esq.) to receive no applicant for membership on the Fire Dept. who is over 30 years of age.

I'm asking your honorable body to have this order passed we do so on account of our Benevolent and Superannuation funds as according to our By-laws. Chap. 2. clause 3. No new member can join our Association who is over 30 years of age. So that a person joining the Dept. who should be over that age would have no protection from our Association and as we are anxious to have all members of the Dept. in our Association we take the liberty of asking your honorable body to pass an order to that effect.

To the Chairman and members of the Fire
Committee of the City of Montreal

Gentlemen

The humble petition of the City
Fire Police and City Fire Company humbly
sheweth that they have an Incorporated Society
under the name of the Firemen's Benevolent
Association; giving support to members of the Fire
Department receiving injury while on duty
as Firemen. Also a Yearly allowance to Widows
and Orphans of Firemen who have received
injuries when on duty as Firemen to cause death
of which the Society has at present two.

Before the establishment of said Society, all
injuries to Firemen were then directly paid by
the Fire Committee. Since the establishment of
said Society, only in very few instances has your
Honorable Body been called upon to give relief.

And now that your Honorable Body has furnish-
ed the Firemen with Rooms that might be
made remunerative by leasing the same to
Societies or other Bodies, subject to the approval
of your Committee, or the Chief of the Fire
Department, said monies to be appropriated
to the use of the Firemen's Benevolent Association
and under the control of its Board of Managers.
And your petitioners would humbly pray that
your Honorable Body would take the matter into
your consideration, and if granted upon what

conditions, and your petitioners as in duty bound will ever pray.
