Dear Sir:-

Some time ago I gave notice in the council that within 30 days I intended to move that a special committee be appointed to study ways and means and steps to be taken so that the city can enter into possession of the pipes and plant of the Montreal Water and Power Co. serving within the limits of the city of Montreal, the whole in accordance with chapters 55, 75 and 56 Vic. Quebec.

As I am preparing my facts and figures to put before the council it is necessary for me to get all the information I can on this very important question. Can you inform me:

1st. If our present pumping plant etc. could now take care of this additional service, if not will your present proposed enlargement and improvements be sufficient and at what date do you think the improvements will be sufficiently advanced to be ready to take on this additional service.

2ndly. When ready what do you estimate will be the additional cost entailed on your department to take care and supply this additional service in wages and maintainance per year, and what do you estimate would be the present additional revenue that they would obtain from such service.

3rdly. Can you give me some idea in round figures of the approximate present value of the pipes and plant belonging to this company at present ~~passing through the city~~ serving these sections, leaving out

of course the pumping plant and the independent main pipes passing through the City serving outside points, which of necessity will have to remain the property of the company, unless it is found necessary to acquire such as well and they to put down new through mains for their outside service. The "Act" does not say that the City will have to enter into the calculations ~~as~~ how the company will have to equip with independent mains to serve the outside points in the event of the city buying out the service ~~and~~ serving within the City. But it might be as well to give me some idea of the estimate cost of the additional new mains they may need to transform their outside City service into an independent service.

4thly. Please give me all other information and figures that you consider need to deal with the solution of this important question. If you prefer that this information should be asked by me through the council I can do so, but all that I want just now is to get a fair estimate of the main facts and figures of the probable cost with the advantages and difficulties that are <sup>your ideas of</sup> ~~included~~ <sup>involved</sup> in the question.

I deem it of the utmost importance that the city deals with this important matter without delay. It is said that the company will soon begin the construction of a new intake which will cost millions, which seems to me an unnecessary public expenditure if your projected improved City aqueduct and intake will be ample and sufficient to take care of the whole district for years to come.

It just simply means this, that if the district around Montreal should be served by a metropolitan <sup>system</sup> of water supply then the city should move at once to prevent millions being spent on <sup>this proposed new</sup> ~~an~~ independent intake <sup>which</sup> ~~that~~ will be unnecessary and ~~all of~~ which will have to be paid for by the city.



the City sooner or later when it becomes necessary to acquire ~~the~~ <sup>the Co</sup> and to serve the whole district from one municipal owned system as in New York Boston and other Cities. It is certain that some day it will be absolutely necessary that a single metropolitan <sup>one</sup> ownership water supply will become imperative as the cheapest and only proper effective method for <sup>private</sup> ~~large~~ <sup>Montreal</sup> ~~Cities~~. Besides the Citizens must not lose sight of the fact that today the company <sup>already</sup> practically controls the whole district surrounding the City, actually a larger district than the City of Montreal is serving <sup>and</sup> <sup>thereby actually</sup> controlling the possibility of all future expansion of the City water service.

I am convinced that now is the time for the City to take up this water question, before this projected new intake of theirs is undertaken. This matter should not be delayed a day longer. It is time that the City and your department ~~begin to move and look ahead towards~~ <sup>solely</sup> this exceedingly important question. The Citizens of this City cannot afford to allow the <sup>future</sup> ~~needed~~ prospects of expansion of a proper and effective Water supply <sup>to be</sup> ~~to be~~ controlled by this company, which further delay will certainly bring.
