My Plumber informs me that his service pipe is 1" diameter and that ^{Yours} this should be the same. I shall, therefore, be glad if you will take note of this application to have the change made in the Spring as soon as weather permits.

We have been put to a great deal of inconvenience of late at our new Office Building by reason of interruptions in the supply of water. On three or four occasions within the last ten days the water service has been discontinued and for hours at a time without notice to us, as a consequence of which the work of cleaning up our offices has had to be suspended. The last time this occurred was on Saturday the 18th. inst., on the evening of which the work of cleaning up the offices had to be suspended altogether. We have no doubt that the interruption was warranted, but at the same time if, in future, it could be arranged to give us some notice of intended disconnection, it would not create the confusion that has resulted on the occurrence of each interruption in the past, i.e. if we knew the water was going to be off for some hours, we could let the cleaners go for a definite time to return to their work when the supply was continued.

We are in receipt of Notice dated Jan. 24th., from your Department, of water waste caused by six balls in the water closets.

For your information, these cocks were temporarily repaired and we are now awaiting tenders from Plumbers to overhaul the whole of the closets, replacing the present system of cisterns with automatic Flushometers.

We will therefore ask your consideration to enable us to make these permanent repairs in a proper manner.

As to the actual waste, amounting to about 150 gals per hour. I think this is rather exaggerated, as we have watched these closets carefully, as much in our own interests, to prevent overflow and damage, as in that of the City, and while through neglect on the part of those using the closets there may be occasional waste, we are using every precaution to overcome this negligence, all of which I trust will be satisfactory to you.

At 11 A.M. I examined the situation myself and did not find one closet over-running.
