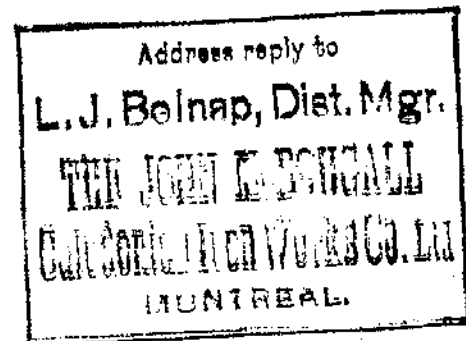

Dear Mr. Barlow,

We are contemplating erecting a light, heat and power station in the rear of our Arts Building and in the neighbourhood of the two water mains and the drain, in respect of which servitudes were granted by the Royal Institution to the City of Montreal by a Deed made before G. F. Papineau and dated 16th February 1856. In this connection I gave this morning a letter to you requesting that facilities be given to Mr. Mitchell for the acquisition of accurate data concerning the location of these pipes, etc. As soon as these data are obtained, I shall have to ask your kind cooperation in facilitating our project.

In the meantime, however, I think we ought to put ourselves in a technically correct position, and I therefore give you one month's notice - in accordance with the terms of the above-mentioned deed - that we intend to do some excavation over the pipes and drain which I have mentioned.

- Le nommé "Albert Rousseau", à la date mentionnée, était occupé, sous la surveillance immédiate du contre-maître M^r. Guilleminette, à charger le charbon dans les tombereaux transportant ce combustible jusqu'aux chaudières à vapeur.

De fait, et malgré les avis répétés par le contre-maître Guilleminette, les hommes occupés à ces travaux accessoires de la Wheel House, au lieu de prendre leur eau à boire à l'un des robinets très nombreux dans les différents panneaux de machines, préféraient et persistaient à la puiser au seau, dans le canal même, sous le prétexte, disant être du reste, que l'eau dans le canal y était plus fraîche qu'ailleurs.

C'est dans une pareille circonstance que le nommé Albert Rousseau, s'était chargé, de sa propre initiative, c. à d. sans qu'il y ait eu pour lui obligation ou nécessité de service, d'aller puiser de l'eau à boire dans le canal, en compagnie d'un autre travailleur,

Il s'avance imprudemment sur la berge du canal descendant à l'eau, et, l'eau étant à l'époque très basse, en même temps que la berge elle-même très rocheuse et glissante, il perdit pied. Dans l'effort qu'il tenta pour remplir d'eau son récipient, il disparut bientôt sans l'eau après s'y être débattu, avoir flotté quelques instants. Malgré la promptitude des secours organisés par le personnel de la Wheel House, le corps du noyé, entraîné par le courant dans le bassin, ce n'est que 5 heures plus tard qu'il fut retrouvé et remis à ses parents.
