
TRIPOD BEAM OUTFIT.



Foundation will be of concrete 12" thick, and the bottom of this foundation will be 54" below the surface of the ground, that is, below the frost line.

DESCRIPTION

The clamp consists of a main frame having three arms to the ends of which are attached the swinging hooks—these swinging hooks catch over the outside of the bell of the pipe and are held in place by means of a chain, which is tightened as shown by a chain hook and nut. The screw through the center of the main frame forces the plug tightly against the end of the pipe, the rubber gasket on the inner surface making a water tight joint.

No. 1 clamp and plug is for 4, 6, 8 and 10 in. pipe.

You may not need all of the plugs at once, therefore we quote them separately so that you can order the ones you require at this time.








No. 1 Clamp on 10-in. Water Main.







We have had no water here since noon yesterday, and we understand you are having serious trouble by reason of a break in the main in Craig street. The cutting off of ^{the} a supply of water is a very serious matter for us. We use a considerable quantity in the manufacture of our product, approximating \$800.00 worth per annum.

We are informed that manufacturers in Delorimier Ave., on either side of us, have not had their supply cut off, which appears to us to be somewhat singular.

The question of water being of such paramount importance to us, we respectfully request that you will give us forthwith your estimate of the length of time during which we are likely to be without a supply. It appears to us that we are also entitled to know why these other manufacturers are being supplied with water while we have none.

In reference to the annexed letter, and also to my conversation with Mr. T. W. Lesage Asst. Supt., I recommend you to extend two hundred and fifty five 255 feet long the present 8" dia. main pipe on Cedar Avenue, and to give to Mr. Geo. Lighthall a 4" water service: considering, this 4" pipe will be use as well as domestic and fire protection water service, therefore, I recommend a Meter, and a deposit of forty four \$44.00 Dollars, to pay $\frac{1}{3}$ the cost of the trench, and the difference in price between 2" to 4" pipe, and also I recommend you to notify Mr. Lighthall that at this point of the city the water has no pressure and to provide himself a necessary installation in his house to obtain water pressure.

I have just taken out a building permit for an apartment building fronting on the south side of Cedar Avenue on Lot No. 1723-7 St. Antoine Ward (formerly known as part of the "Day Property"). The building will contain 15 apartments.

In making enquiries I have not been able to ascertain what pressure of water is at hydrant level on Cedar Avenue opposite this property or what size of water connection I should have to the property.

Mr. Veary, one of the clerks in your Department, I believe, suggested writing to you on the subject and ~~and~~ that one of your Inspectors might meet my Contractor on Cedar Avenue and decide the matter with him. It is important to me to have as large a main as is necessary to give an adequate supply and besides I am contemplating putting in a small stand pipe in the centre part of the building for fire purposes. If you will send a man up please let me know by "phone " or otherwise and I will arrange with my builder to meet him if you will give me sufficient notice.

As I desire to commence building operations at once your early reply will be deemed a favor.





Dear Sir:-

Your letter 14th. inst. to hand. Owing to my being out of town, most of the time since its receipt, accounts for not replying earlier. I am sorry that after over three months of the passing of the order in council requesting your department to prepare a list of the streets wherein you intended to have larger water mains placed, previous to permanent pavements, to be told that your department have not had time to do so on account of not having a sufficient staff to prepare such a list.

When I had this order passed by the council I was not aware that the state of affairs, as regards water mains were so bad that it would actually require ~~an~~ additional staff to make up a list ~~of all the streets needing them~~, and besides is the public to understand that there is no existing plan already prepared showing your projected improvements to the water mains of the City, I can hardly beleive that.

Are the needs of the defective sections to be left simply to the demands and complaints of the Citizens and the Aldermen? Is the superintendent not the one to see and provide ahead for all important defects before complaints and demands are made,

You will remember that last spring when the allotment for the permanent paving of various streets were before the finance committee you seemed to know off hand all the needs of the various

streets by heart and in less than half an hour you gave the names of the various streets ^{on that list} needing new mains. On that list ^{was} many of the most important streets and those most needing permanent pavements were knocked out, ^{you prepared} ~~you~~ no report ~~previous to that~~ existed, as far as I know, showing this sad condition of affairs ^{yet} ~~and~~ half the work ~~done by~~ the Roads estimate of cost was thrown out and ~~the work was~~ ^{done by}

Since then I have managed to get orders put through ~~to~~ ^{then still} pipe a few streets, but the bulk of the streets condemned by you remain unpiped and nothing ^{being} is done to cure the defects. ?

As for the need of a larger staff, you will remember you expressed to me great disappointment that you were not nominated as one of the experts on the ~~conduit~~ system. I also notice you have been named one of the experts on the River St. Pierre draining commission, a matter which actually belongs to the roads and not ^{to} the water department ^{at all} also I understand you have since visited France.

I have had occasion to write you on public matters before and I am exceedingly sorry to receive replies of "No time" "Impossible"


I do not care to ask ~~you about the roads~~ ^{or} simply a list of the streets wanting new mains in my division, as I don't give my service simply to my division. I feel that it is a great inconvenience to the Citizens and loss to the City that this present condition of affairs exists as regards needs of water mains before putting down permanent pavements.

This state of affairs should and must be ~~mended~~ ^{ended}, the public are losing patience and it is for you to plan and provide the remedy, this cannot continue for ever. Whilst I do not intend to concede to the point that it is impossible to prepare a list of all the streets in the City needing new mains, ^{such a list} ~~this~~ should exist already, still as I must move for permanent pavement of the streets in my division, I would ask you to therefore send me a list of the streets in St. Andrews and St. Montréal



Dear Sir:--

Yours 26th. inst. to hand and contents noted.. My dear Janin, I assure you I have no ill will or personal ill feelings against you. All that I have written you, you will find soon or later was and is for your own good, for ^{the} ~~the~~ warned is to be forearmed. My letter simply expressed the public temper which you will have to meet sooner or later on the conditions of affairs as they see them, on matters directly under your superintendence some place some time. No water, dirty water, new pavements torn up, cuts in streets remaining uncovered for months and some of our principal streets with unspeakable pavements, remaining unrepaired because of the need of new mains.

Speaking for the upper Western and Central divisions, last year nearly all the streets listed for new pavements were cut out, by your own declaration, from their rightful share of new pavements because they needed new mains. We aldermen representing these divisions have our duty to perform as well as you have and if we neglect to see that proper progress is made to cure the ills existing we will fail in our duty.

Now I desire not only to put myself on record against these ^{ills} ~~ills~~, but I hereby offer to assist you to cure them, but to do so it is absolutely necessary that we should know the exact needs from your stand point so that we can assist you with the needed financial assistance. Years go by and there is apparently no special effort to

cure ~~these~~ ^{these} ~~stagnating~~ ^{stagnating} affairs

Here we are with the working season upon us and no move or no plan to get these needed improvements carried out, our hands are tied ^{as Aldermen} for the need of proper information ^{in time} on the things required. You say you are sending me a list of the streets in my ward where new mains are required. Please do so as soon as possible including St. Georges and St. Lawrence division and greatly oblige.

I visited the Cincinnati new Water works last fall, including there splendid filtering plant. The chief engineer accompanied our party of Aldermen. It is a magnificent work and is visited by engineers from all over the world. Its double pumping ^{system and} work, massive filtering house and glass brick lined conduits gives high pressure ^{filtered} ^{water} throughout the City. The cost price and the time for constructions were almost exactly figured out from the beginning. Why should not the public know now what our works are going to be when completed and when they will be completed, including the ^{and what they will cost} ~~filling of the whole with~~ ^{filtering plant} water. The water we are getting now for most of the year is simply abominable.

I examined some of the mains opened for repairs last year and found that they were almost half filled with disgusting filth. If the public would see the condition of filth of some of our mains there would be a rebellion. What is the use of our board of health when our water mains are in such a condition and no word or no move whatever, to cure this state of affairs. Some times I think the whole thing should be handed over to a commission.

I do not want to raise a public fuss, if the defects can possibly be cured without it, but unless some marked progress is made this summer I am going to kick up a fuss that will bring on marked

improvement. The public are not going to stand this state of affairs
much longer ^{I consider that} both the staff and the water committee ^{should wake up} ~~will work up~~
and get busy. ^{as a} If you need money and a larger staff let ~~me know~~ ^{as a}

proper and well defined plan that ~~can be used~~. ^{as your voice be heard}
^{I look for such a committee needs ahead that we will all be}
^{caught short soon} Yours truly,

I was away yesterday so I only found on my desk this morning the plans you sent me yesterday showing condition of streets' water mains in St. Andrews, St. George and St. Lawrence Divisions. I must say that they are very neat and ^{easy understood} ~~legible~~ and will, I trust, prove useful. I would like to see such plans prepared for every ward. Please accept my thanks for the list.

I must push the road department for similar plans, showing conditions of ^{sewers} ~~mains~~ and gas pipes so that all who work and vote for improvement will know the exact state of affairs, ^{so as} not to bewilder and annoy and blame, but to help the chiefs with their work.

I intend to call on you, as suggested, and have a quiet talk over troubles that the public are getting very impatient about. For instance that cut on St. Catherine Street from Peel to Bleury that has been open since early last fall until now. I wish you would go up there today with your chairman and see for yourself and I think you will agree with me that this requires immediate attention. You may have good reasons for delaying these repairs ~~saying~~, but the public do not know your reasons. Such cuts should be covered with ^{planks} ~~boards~~ until the ground is ^{is done} settled, as in other Cities, especially on this very busy thorough fare. The loss to the proprietors in dirt etc. would have paid for the ~~planks~~ many times. These planks could be used again and again in future cases. Why not try the plan on all filled in cuts awaiting pavements ^{in the future}.

Now please do not take offence with what I may say in council or ⁱⁿ writing you I have no intention to quarrel, or trouble, or bewilder you or the chairman. The trouble is the chairman is so seldom criticised or questioned that he seems to be inclined to take such as a personal offence if one word of impatience is said.

As most of these streets are closely built with residents possibly they may not need new pipes for many years. Will you please look over the enclosed list and let me know if some can be excused so I can get a share of new pavement for those that can be excused, especially those above mentioned. *If pipes must be put*

in Kindly get estimates out and have reports sent to council to have the pipes put in at as early a date as possible. I would be much obliged for your prompt attention to this. If necessary I can call and consult on this subject. If you advise this drop me a postal giving me an appointment.


