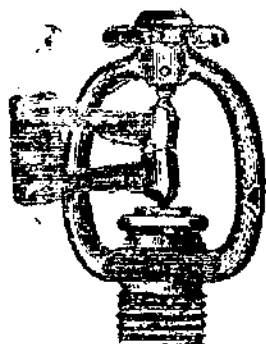





Upon the report of an Engineer of the Board approving of the said plan and profile and proof of service of notice of this application upon the Railway Company—

IT IS ORDERED that the applicant be, and it is hereby authorized, at its own expense, to lay the said ~~water main~~ under the above mentioned track of the Railway Company, at the point and in the manner shown on the said plan and profile; and thereafter to maintain, renew, and repair the same as may be necessary, upon and subject to the observance and performance by the Applicant, in all respects, of the terms and conditions following, namely:—

1. That the said ~~pipe,~~ where laid under the said track and for a distance of at least ten feet beyond the outermost rails thereof, be ~~twelve~~ inches in diameter in the clear, be of ~~cast iron~~ or such other material as may from time to time be directed by the Board, and be laid at a depth of not less than ~~five~~ feet below the base of rail; and that the joints of the said ~~pipe~~ be at all times securely ~~cemented together,~~ so as to prevent any leakage therefrom.

2. That all work in connection with the laying, maintaining, renewing, and repairing of the said pipe and the continued supervision of the same be performed by, and all

costs and expenses thereby incurred be borne and paid by, the Applicant; but that no work at any time be done under the authority of this order in such a manner as to obstruct, delay, or in any way interfere with the operation of any of the trains or traffic of the Railway Company or other company using the said railway.

3. IT IS ORDERED that the applicant be, and it is hereby authorized, at its own expense, to lay the said water main under the above mentioned track of the Railway Company, at the point and in the manner shown on the said plan and profile; and thereafter to maintain, renew, and repair the same as may be necessary, upon and subject to the observance and performance by the Applicant, in all respects, of the terms and conditions following, namely:—

1. That the said pipe, where laid under the said track and for a distance of at least ten feet beyond the outermost rails thereof, be eight inches in diameter in the clear, be of cast or such other material as may from time to time be directed by the Board, and be laid at a depth of not less than seven feet below the base of rail; and that the joints of the said pipe be at all times securely attached together, so as to prevent any leakage therefrom.

2. That all work in connection with the laying, maintaining, renewing, and repairing of the said pipe and the continued supervision of the same be performed by, and all

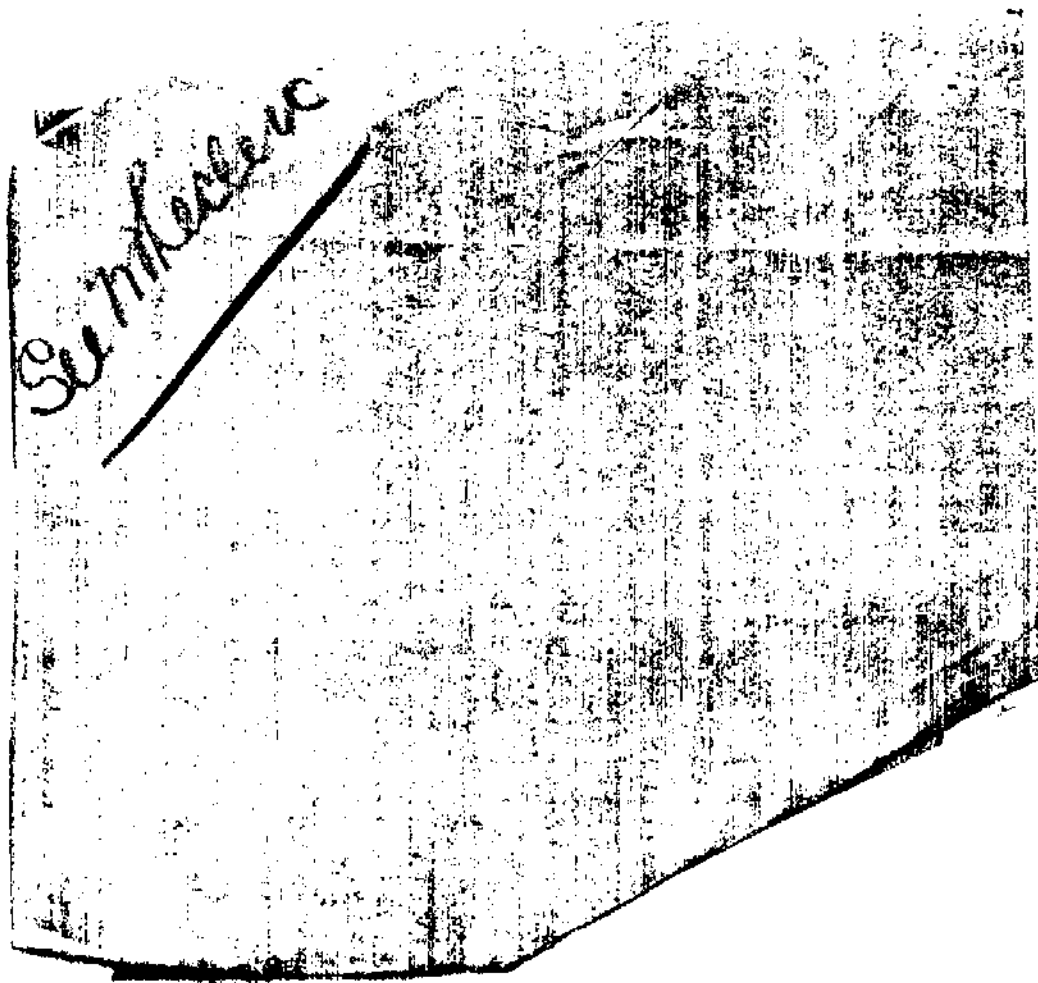

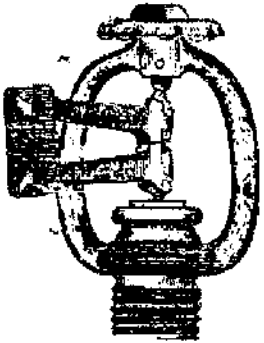
