Sir I beg to call your attention  
to the fact that the late William Boyard to  
whose estate I have been appointed Curator.  
paid the sum of about £40 for the goodwill  
of his stall as can be proved by parties who  
saw him pay the money. That when  
he died the rent had been paid up till the Saturday  
previous to his illness and that before the  
fall of the stall, the two weeks' rent was  
tendered by me through a Notary to the proper  
officers of the Corporation. Under these  
circumstances I respectfully claim Compensation  
of the Corporation, in behalf of his family  
relatives who reside in England, and who  
I doubt not it will appear to you, should  
not be deprived of all Compensation for the  
large sum paid by their deceased Mother  
in good faith. Without stating other Considera-  
tions that more of equity which should  
influence the Committee, I beg in the meantime  
to submit the question of Compensation  
to their favorable Consideration.
