# Corporation of Montreal

## Bye Laws

of the Council, of the City  
of Montreal, concerning  
the Salaries of the Mayor  
and Officers of the Corporation

---

The Mayor, Aldermen  
and Citizens of the City of  
Montreal, duly assembled  
in Council at the City Hall,  
in the City of Montreal on  
Saturday the Seventh  
day of November One thousand  
eight hundred and forty, in  
virtue of the authority vested  
in them, in and by an  
Ordinance of the Governor

of the Province of Lower  
Canada and the Special  
Council for the Affairs of the  
Said Province, made and  
passed in the Fourth Year  
of the Reign of Her Majesty,  
intituled; - "An Ordinance  
" to incorporate the City and  
" Town of Montreal "-

Do Ordain

and

It is hereby Ordained and  
Enacted

---

Section 1.

That the Mayor of the  
City shall have and receive  
a Salary of Three hundred  
pounds, Current Money  
per Annum, in lieu of  
all fees and perquisites.

Section 2.

And be it further Enacted

That

That the City Clerk shall have and receive a Salary of Three hundred pounds, Current Money per Annum, in lieu of all fees and perquisites, and shall give Security, himself in Five hundred pounds, Current money, and two Sureties in Two hundred and fifty pounds said Current Money each, for the due execution of his Office.

Section 3.

And be it further enacted, that the Treasurer of the City, shall have and receive a Salary of Three hundred pounds, Current Money per Annum, in lieu of all fees and perquisites. Provided, that the said Treasurer do, by an Instrument in writing,

by

by him signed, in presence of the Mayor, and another Member of the Council, formally renounce to any other right, advantage, perquisite or per Centage, he may be entitled to have and receive as such Treasurer, by and in virtue of any Laws, now in force in this Province, and shall give good and sufficient Security, for the due execution of his Office, himself in Two thousand pounds, Current Money, and two Sureties, each in One thousand pounds, said Current Money.

Section 4. And be it further enacted, that the Surveyor of Highways, Streets and Bridges of the City, shall have and receive

a Salary of Three hundred pounds, Current Money per Annum, in lieu of all fees and perquisites.

Section 5.

And be it further enacted, that the Overseer of Highways, Streets and Bridges of the City, shall have and receive a Salary of One hundred pounds, Current Money, per annum, in lieu of all fees and perquisites.

Section 6.

And be it further enacted, that The Messenger of the Corporation shall have and receive a Salary of Sixty pounds, Current Money, per annum, besides his lodging in the City Hall, the necessary fuel and lights.

And

Section 7.

And be it further enacted, that the Clerk of the Weigh-house, shall have and receive, a salary of sixty pounds, Current Money per annum, in lieu of all fees and perquisites, and shall give good and sufficient Security, for the due execution of his Office, himself in One hundred pounds, Current Money, and two Sureties, each in Fifty pounds, said Current Money. - And all fees and emoluments which the Clerk of the Market is now entitled to have and receive, for weighing and measuring, by and in virtue of the sixth Article, of the fifth Chapter, of the Rules and Regulations of Police, made and passed by the Justices of the Peace, for the

the City of Montreal, in their  
Court of General Quarter Sessions  
of the Peace, held on the  
tenth day of January, one  
thousand eight hundred  
and twenty one, shall thence-  
forth cease to belong to the  
said Clerk of the Market,  
and shall be received by the  
said Clerk of Weigh-house,  
for benefit of this Corporation,  
and paid over to the City  
Treasurer, to be applied as  
the Law directs.

---

Section 8. And be it further enacted,  
that the Clerk of the Haymarket  
in Commissioner's Square,  
shall have and receive a  
Salary of One hundred  
and fifty pounds, Current  
money per annum, in lieu  
of all fees and perquisites,

and



and shall give good and  
sufficient Security for the  
due execution of his Office,  
himself in the sum of  
Two hundred and fifty pounds  
Current Money, and two  
Sureties, each in the sum  
of One hundred and twenty  
five pounds. Said Current  
Money. - And all fees  
and emoluments which the  
Clerk of the said Haymarket,  
is now entitled to have and  
receive, for weighing Hay  
or Straw, by and in virtue  
of the second Article, of the  
third Chapter of the above  
Rules and Regulations of  
Police, shall henceforth  
cease to belong to the said  
Clerk of the Haymarket,  
but shall be, by him received,  
for the benefit of this Corporation,  
and paid over to the City  
Treasurer,

Treasurer, to be applied as  
the Law directs.

Section 9. And be it further enacted,  
that the Clerk of the New-  
Market, shall have and  
receive a Salary of One  
hundred and sixty five  
pounds, Current Money,  
per Annum, in lieu of all  
fees and perquisites, and  
shall give good and suffi-  
cient Security, for the due  
execution of his Office. him-  
self, in the sum of Two  
hundred and fifty pounds,  
Current Money, and two  
Sureties, each in the sum  
of One hundred and twenty  
five pounds, said Current  
Money. - And all fees  
and emoluments, which the  
said Clerk of the Newmarket  
is

is now entitled to have and receive, by and in virtue of the Sixth Article, of the fifth Chapter, of the above recited Rules and Regulations, shall henceforth cease to belong to the said Clerk of the New Market, but shall be by him, received and collected, with the exception of such of the said Fees, which are ordered by the Seventh Article of the present Bye-Laws, to be collected by the Clerk of the Weigh-house, for the benefit of this Corporation, and paid over to the City Treasurer to be applied as the Law directs.

Section 10. And be it further enacted, that all the above Salaries shall

shall be paid monthly,  
from and out of the monies  
belonging to the City. - City.

Upon the first day of  
each month, upon an order  
in writing of the Council of  
the City, signed by three  
members of the said  
Council, and countersigned  
by the Clerk of the City.
