CORPORATION OF MONTREAL

BY-LAW to impose a duty on Billiard Tables.

At a Special Meeting of the Council of the City of Montreal held in the City Hall of the said City this fourth day
of February in the now year of Our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and sixty-seven, under and by virtue of the Act of the
Provincial Legislature 14 and 15 Vict.ch.128, in the manner
and after observance of all the formalities prescribed by
the said Act, at which said Meeting not less than two-thirds
ofv the members of the Council, to wit: the following members
thereof are present, viz: His Worship the Mayor Henry Starnes,
esquire, ALDERMEN: Gorrie, Contant, David, Bowie, Holland, Stevenson, Rodden, McCready, Goygtte, COUNCILLORS: McGauvran, Poupart,
OGilvie, Brown, Cassidy, Bastien, Labelle, Leduc, Lanctot, Bernard,
Alexander, St-Charles and Masterman,

IT IS ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the said Council as follows:

SECTION 1--The thirty-nineth section of the By-Law known and designated under chapter VI (six) of the Codified By-Laws of this City now in force is hereby repealed and the following section substituted in its stead:

SECTION 2-- An annual duty of one hundred dollars shall be paid by the occupant or occupants, proprietor or proprietors of each and every house of public entertainment, hotel, inn, licensed tavern, public boarding house, or any other place of public resort, entertainment or amusement whatever in the said City for one Billiard Table, of Fifty dollars for the second billiard table, and of twenty for each and every additional bibleard table, and of One Hundred dollars for each and every Missisipi, bagatelle or any other gambling board

with balls, which now is gr may hereafter be erected or kept in any such house of public entertainment, hotel, ing, or licensed tavern, public boarding house or other place of public resort, entertainment or amusement, and a duty of One. Hundred dollars shall be paid by the occupant or proprietor of any house, apartment or other place in the said City for one billiard table, of fifty dollars for the second billiard table and of seventy dollars for each and every additional. billiard table and of One Hundred dollars for each and every Missisipi, bagatelle or other gambling board with balls, which now is or may hereafter be established or kept for the use of any association or number of subscribers or for any person whomsoever other than the said occupant of the said house, apartment, or other place, and a duty of Twenty dollars shall be paid by all legally established clubs, for each and every billiard table which they may own or have the exclusive use of, and every person, occupant, proprietor or Club, as the case may be, who shall set up, erect or keep a billiard table, missisipi, bagatelle or any other gambling board with balls without having previously paid the said annual duty according to the respective rates hereinbefore specified shall incur and pay a fine not exceeding twenty dollars and a like fine for every day such person, occupant, proprietor or 61ub shall fail to comply with the provisions of this By-Law or continue in the violation thereof .-

BY-LAW To Impose a Duty on Billiard Tables.

A T a SPECIAL MEETING of the COUNCIL of the CITY of MONTREAL, held in the City Hall of the said City, this Fourth Day or FEBRUARY, in the now year of our Lord, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-seven, un der and by virtue of the Act of the Provincial Legislature, is and is Victoria, cap. 128, in the manner and after observance of all the formalities prescribed in and by the said Act; at which said meeting not less than two-thirds of the Members of the Council, to wit : the following members thereof, are present, viz.:—His Worship the Mayor, Henry Starnes, Esq.; Aldermen Gorrie, Contant, David, Bowie, Rolland, Stevenson, Rodden, McCready, Goyette; Councillors McGauvran, Poupart, Ogilvie, Brown, Cassidy, Bastlen, Labelle, Leduc, Lanctot, Bernard, Alexander, St. Charles, and Masterman; It is ordained and enacted by the said Council, as follows:

Sec. L.-The Thirty-ninth section of the By-la known and designated under chapter VI (siz) of the Codified By-laws of this Uity, now in force, is hereby repealed, and the

following section substituted in its stend: Sec. 2.—An Annual duly of One Hundred Dol-LARS thall be paid by the occupant or occupacia, proprietor or proprietors of each and every House of Public Entertaloment, Hotel, Inn, Licensed Tavern, Public Boarding liouse, or any other place of public resort, entertainment or amusement what-ever in the said City, for one Billiard Table; of FIFTY DOLLARS for the second Billiard Table, and or Twenty for each and every additional Billiard Table, and of One Hundred Dollars for each and every Mississippi, Bagatelle or any other gambling Board with Balis, which now is or may hereafter be erected or kept in any such House of Public Entertainment, Rotel, Inn, or Licersed Tavern, Public Boarding House, or other place of public resort, onterlainment or amusement; and a duty of One Hundred Dollars shall be paid by the occupant or proprietor of any house, apart, ment, or other place, in the said City, for one Billiard Table, of Fifty Dollars for the second Billiard Table, and of Seventy Dollard Table, and of One Hundred Dol-lars for each and every Mississippi, Bagatelle, or other gambling board with balls, which now is or may hereafter be established or kept for the use of any association, or number of subscribers, or for any person whomsoever, other than the raid occupant of the said House, apariment or other place; and a duty of TWENTY DOLLARS shall be paid by all legally ex-tablished Clubs, for each and every Billiard Table which they may own or have the exclusive use of; and any person, occupant,

proprietor, or Club, as the case may be who shall set up, erect or keep a Billiard Table, Mississippi, Begatelle, or any other gambling board with balls, without having previously paid the said annual duty, ac cording to the respective rates hereinbefore
