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REGLEMENT MUNICIPAL no 10
8 mai 1867

1867 Evaluation des bâtisses rue Notre-Dame

CORPORATION OF MONTREAL

BY-LAW of the Council of the City of Montreal

to levy a special assessment on real estate
in Notre-Dame street.-

WHEREAS the ~~the~~ Council of the City of Montreal on the sixth day of July one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four resolved to acquire all the pieces or parcels of ground required to widen Notre-Dame street in accordance with the thirtieth section of the Act 27 and 28 Victoria, ch.60 and have in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act acquired the pieces or parcels of ground required for the widening of the third section of the said street by depositing in the hands of the Prothonotary of the Superior Court the cost thereof (as fixed and determined by that report of the Commissioners for Notre-Dame street, which was duly confirmed and homologated by the said Court on the seventh day of February one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five) to wit: the sum of Ninety Three Thousand Eight Hundred ^{and} seven dollars thirty one cents, and WHEREAS it is provided in and by the thirty third section of the above cited Act and the second section of the Act 29th Vict. ch.58 that any proprietor in the second, third or fourth sections of Notre-Dame street aforesaid whose property or a portion of whose property is required for the said improvement, who may be desirous of anticipating the time fixed for the carrying out the said improvement in front of his property may do so by giving a written notice of such his intention to the Corporation, and that the said Corporation shall thereupon deposit in the hands of the Prothonotary of the said Court within fifteen days from and after the said notice the amount of the price and compensation, which shall have been set upon the said property by the

said Commissioners, and WHEREAS several proprietors in the fourth section of Notre-Dame street aforesaid, (to wit: M^r. Daniel Gorrie, Judge Berthelot, Albert Furniss, the estate Joseph Masson and A.M. Delisle) have availed themselves of the privilege thus granted them by giving the notice of anticipation required by law, and the said Corporation have in consequence deposited in the hands of the Prothonotary of the Superior Court the compensation set upon the properties of the above proprietors by the said Commissioners amounting in the aggregate to the sum of Eighteen Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty Three dollars thirty seven cents, which added to the sum of Ninety Three Thousand Eight Hundred and Seven dollars thirty one cents form together the sum of One Hundred and Twelve Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty dollars sixty eight cents, and WHEREAS it is provided by the fourth subsection of section thirty of the said Act that one half of the cost of the said improvement shall be borne by the said Corporation and the other half by the proprietors in the said Notre-Dame street by means of a special assessment to be levied upon the real estate fronting on Notre-Dame street the whole of which shall be equally rated or assessed to provide one half the expense of the said improvement and that the assessed value of all real estate fronting on the said street for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four shall be held to be the assessed value thereof for all the purposes of the said improvement; and WHEREAS it is also provided by the thirty first section of the said Act that the said Council may, after the homologation of the report of the said Commissioners for each section of the said street, levy by By-Law a special rate or assessment as aforesaid sufficient to cover one half of the expenditure incurred in the widening of each section of the said street, and WHEREAS it is now incumbent upon the said Council to levy by special asses

ment, under the provisions aforesaid, on all real estate fronting on Notre-Dame one half of the said sum of One Hundred and Twelve Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty dollars sixty-eight cents, to wit: the sum of Fifty Six Thousand Three Hundred and eighty dollars thirty four cents,

At a Special Meeting of the Council of the City of Montreal held in the City Hall of the said City, this eighth day of May in the now year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, under and by virtue of the Act of the Provincial Legislature 14 and 15 Victoria, ch. 128, in the manner and after observance of all the formalities prescribed in and by the said Act, at which said Meeting not less than two-thirds of the members of the Council, to wit: the following members thereof are present, viz: His Worship the Mayor Henry Starnes, esquire, ALDERMEN: Gorrie, Rodden, McCready, David, Valois, Bastien, Poupart, COUNCILLORS: Brown, Cassidy, Mercier, Labelle, Leduc, Lanctot, Bernard, St-Charles, Alexander, McGauvran, Masterman, Holland, Taylor, Doutre, Munro, McShane,

IT IS ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the said Council and the said Council do hereby ordain and enact:

That a special assessment at the rate of two dollars fifty two cents and three quarters of a cent for every one hundred dollars of the assessed value of all real estate fronting on Notre-Dame street, the said assessed value as set forth and established in and by the assessment books for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four be made and levied upon the proprietors of real estate fronting on Notre-Dame street aforesaid, which said special assessment shall be due and payable on the fifteenth day of ~~May~~ ^{May} instant, and applied towards the payment of the said sum of Fifty Six Thousand Three Hundred and Eighty dollars thirty-four cents, being one half of the cost of widening the third and portions of the fourth section of Notre-Dame street as aforesaid.-
