The following is a true copy of a resolution passed by the County Council of said county at the general session thereof held at the "County House" in the Town of Bedford, in said county, on Wednesday, the eleventh day of December, A. D., 1912 :—

Moved by Councillor Juaire,
Seconded by Councillor Senesac,

That this council is of the opinion, that the law as now existing, for the payment of the board and entertainment of the insane in the asylums, and children in reformatories of this province, presents great difficulties, in its application, it being often difficult to ascertain the true domicile of the insane and the consequent liability of the county, and should be abrogated and that by the intervention and assistance of the member of this county, an application may be made to the Provincial Legislature with a view of amending the law in such a manner that in the future the costs of maintaining and boarding the insane at the asylums may be paid wholly by the provincial government, without recourse upon the local or county municipalities, and that a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the member J. J. B. Gosse- lin with an earnest request that he exercise his influence with the govern- ment for the amendment of the law in the sense above indicated.


