



Receives £1. 5. 0 from each Butcher
Stall for his fees. There are Fifty two stalls. The
£1. 5. 0. is paid by the Butchers over and above
and a part from the purchase money of the
Stalls $\frac{1}{3}$ per day, is paid by the Venders of
Pork and Salt Fish. The average Number
of those Venders is twenty. Receives half of that
sum or $\frac{7}{12}$ per day from each. There are usually
on Tuesdays and Fridays from two to four
Venders of Eggs near the document who pay
 $\frac{1}{3}$ each per day. They are very seldom there
except on those days. Received One third the
Amount paid by those vendors. There are besides
daily from two to five hucksters who pay $\frac{1}{3}$
each ^{ft} table on a market day. Some of them
take two tables. Receives One third of what
they pay. In Summer there are about Sixty
Fruiterers in the Market who pay $\frac{3}{4}$ per day,
the whole of which is received by the Clerk of the
Market. In Winter there are usually between
30 to 40. of those Fruiterers. The summer
stands from 1st May to 1st November of
the Fruiterers only about 10 or 12 pay in Winter.
In the Fish Market there are Sixty three
Stalls when occupied $\frac{1}{3}$. each is paid for the use
of each one. The Average or Number of stalls ac-
curred from the 1st April to the 1st November
is between 15 and 20 - Receives half the fee
paid for the fish stalls. The Fish Market is
rented during the Winter for between £10. and
£12 - by the Bellay Estates. The weigh houses some
days pays nothing at all. The largest Amount
ever received on any one day was between 8 and
9 £ - It yields from £80. to £84 per annum.

Receives

Receives the whole amount for himself. The cattle
Market pays nothing either to the Town or the Clerk.
By his Commission he is appointed Clerk of
all the Markets in the City. The statute in virtue
of which the Saint Ann's Market was created de-
crees to be placed under his Care and Receives
£50 per annum from the Saint Ann's Market
in view of all fees - except the fees for Weighing them.
Has a scale and weight his personal property thereof;
Realizes at Saint Ann's only about £2 10. 0 per
annum. The Trustees have a person Joseph
Durand at the Market to take care of it under
his direction.

Expences - Pays the man who attends to the
weighing principally and other matters, when
required £50. per annum. This man can write
a letter and collects the dues of the market - causes
the market to be swept once a week each
Saturday Evening at his own expence. The
Town pays for the Carrying away of the filth
to sweep from the 1st May to 15th November.
From 15th November to 1st May -

Pays a man by agreement £37. 10/- per annum
for sweeping the market and is obliged at that
rate to do everything required of him besides
the sweeping. He acts as constable & sometimes
employs his own private servant to assist
at the market. Is not obliged to feed the man
who receives the £37. 10/- but another man to
whom he pays 50 Pounds per annum; exclusive
of the salaries paid the men the whole expences
were in 1835 - £37. 8. 52 - In 1836 - £42. 10. 4 -
In 1837 - £28. 18. 72 - in 1838 £25. 17. 02 - and
in 1839. £59. 16. 5 - A beam of Scales for

In which about £15- were paid is included in
the expenses of 1839-, will produce the Books
and Statement in about 8 days Mr. Blanchard
was Associate Clerk for about 15 years -
and received about £100 per annum - during
that time as a consideration for his having
relived.

Mr. Blanchard was appointed Clerk of
Hay Market in February 1833 - Has kept
Books of account since his appointment and
reproduced them. Will furnish a statement
of the Revenue of the Market, its expenses, and
the rates paid for weighing, of hay &c. The Revenue
of the Market is, wholly the Clerks, by whom
the expenses of it are of course paid.

Mr. Leprohon examined. Received his present
Commission, produced to the Committee
on the 27th day of April 1836 - while the
Old Market was yet in existence at times

there were 200-300, and 400. Carters. There are
now 600 Carters in the City of Montreal;
who each pay him as Clerk the sum of 1/3^d
Currency. The Measuring of grain does
not on an average exceed One pound per
Acreum; and is included in the Account
declared to be received for weighing. Believes
that he will this year supply 700 Number
to Carters, last year there were from 5 to
6 hundred Carters. Receives 1/3^d. for each
Number supplied to a Carter, Receives at
an average for the Measurement of Barley
Scarcely of anything else, Has not record
perhaps more than four dollars in that Ac-
count since this appointment; and that amount
has been included in the weighing Account
with the exception of the return made by
Mr. Leprohon to the City Authorities, and
occasionally when required to the execution
he only kept a general Statement of the
gross receipts and expenditures of the
Market on a fly leaf of paper for his
own satisfaction, not having been requi-
sted by the Magistrate, or Encouraging him-
self bound to keep any other account.
Has never lost he thinks 5/- by the delivery
of Fresh Fish at the Fish Market, and
never he believes lost more than Two pounds
in all by the Vendors of Salt Provisions on the
Market. Thinks there is a space enough
on the West side of the Market for the
accommodation of Twenty Vegetable
Vendors from the environs of the City; and
that a tax of One Shilling on each would
be

be a fair amount to impose on them believe
 that many Gardeners would pay an annual
 rent even to the extent of £10 - Currency
 exclusively of the 1/- Tax alluded to, for the
 purpose of being allowed to retain a parti-
 culor place in the market. The said places
 ought to be sold by public Auction, and
 sufficient time allowed to each vendor to bid
 East or Southeaster, & W. Lepishow here pro-
 duced the Books of account kept by him
 as Clerk of the market consisting of two
 bound Books and four unbound Copies
 together with a letter from a late Governor
 to him, - W. Lepishow, and Three Manuscript
 Statements. Is of opinion that all
 Farmers Carts & in the North East side of
 the Market should pay ~~the sum~~ 1/- each for
 their places in the Market, there is space on
 that side of the market for 85 Carts, is of
 opinion that the Gardeners now pay a sufficient
 sum for their privileges. The vendors of fresh
 Butter, averaging fifty a day, ought each
 to pay 6 pence ~~per day~~, is of opinion that
 each Farmer shall pay 1/- according to the
 market ought to pay 1/- each, and be allowed
 5 feet space per journey who unloads his
 produce, on the market, The weigh House
 might be let for £200 per annum, and the
 scales advantageously removed elsewhere. The
 Police Station House belongs to the City but
 no rent is paid for its occupation at present
 There are 52 Butchers Stalls in the New Market,
 and they averaged £29. Rent per stall.
 Thinks that live Sheep, Calves, Pigs and

other small animals should be taxed at three
 pence each: and horned cattle at least sixpence
 each, -

Mr. Lepishow's examination was concluded by
 Mr. P. Biland examined, Produced his com-
 mission as Clerk of the Hay market, and
 the Books of Account kept by him, Accounting
 to Six in Milwaukee, which he declare, were kept
 for his private use and not intended for Public
 examination, also produced a Report in re-
 ference to the Hay Market, embracing
 part of the year 1833 - and the whole of the
 subsequent years from that time, The net
 Revenue of the last year was £298. 11. 3 00
 under the existing tariff, The Revenue of
 Hay market from the 10th June 1839 to
 the same date in 1840 - has been £256. 12. 11
 Currency and for a more detailed statement
 refers to the Report supplied: all he has under

Supply in writing his suggestion as to the

 the weigh House would be better situated
 if reduced to the space in the rear of it leaving
 at present to the rear portion, and that all
 persons

persons selling Hay after their loads were weighed
should be sent to that lot.
Mr. Oliver Larangea examined. Is assistant
to Mr. Leprohon Clerk of the Market, and acts
for him in his absence. He has been only a little more
than 2 months in Mr. Leprohon's employ. can
read, and write. Has weighed and collected the
fees of the Clerk of Market since he has been
in the employment of Mr. Leprohon. Can do
the collection and make the Market return
without the assistance of Mr. Leprohon
and thinks himself perfectly qualified
to fill the situation of Clerk of the Market.
In the absence of Mr. Leprohon has performed
the duties he thinks, as well as if Mr. Leprohon
were present. If any difficulties arose
on the Market had authority from Mr.
Leprohon to act in Mr. Leprohon's absence
for him, and always made the collections.
The dealers of Fresh fish pay regularly
when on the Market. The dealers of Salt
Provisions and Meats also pay regularly
and nothing is ever lost on their account. Has 2 $\frac{1}{4}$
per day as salary. Is not paid for Sundays or
Holidays and provides himself with food. Mr.
Leprohon is sometimes obliged to absent himself
to attend the other Market, also absents himself
in the afternoon comes in the morning at 7 $\frac{1}{2}$
to o'clock A.M., goes to breakfast at 8, returns
about half past 9, or 10 o'clock, and goes to his
dinner at one o'clock P.M., and seldom returns
after his dinner. Thinks if Mr. Leprohon were
sick, or otherwise necessarily absent he could
fill his situation in every respect as well as he
could.

could fill his situation in every respect as well as he
could. Thinks if Mr. Leprohon were sick a fortnight he could perform the duties
in the Market and the Corporation Garnitures of
the City funds would not suffer by the circumstances.
Has not as much experience as Mr. Leprohon having been
only two months on the Market. Does not know
legal knowledge as Mr. Leprohon. Does not know
what the expenses of the Market are. Since he has been
there Mr. Leprohon has made no improvement in it.
One Durand, at the Saint James Market, helps
the rats for Mr. Leprohon there in the same capacity
as he acts at the New Market. Does not know if
Durand can read or write. Knows he has charge
of the Saint James Market, was told by Mr. Leprohon
that he was employed by him for that Market, & chiefly
to a question of Mr. Berthelot. Witness was
introduced to Mr. Leprohon by Mr. Berthelot by whom
the situation was obtained for him. Is ignorant
if he can fulfill the duties of Clerk of the Market
except as regards the weighing, collecting and
placing of the Horses and Vehicles. Is ignorant
if he can preserve the peace as effectually on the
Market as Mr. Leprohon. Has more influence on
the Market than the witness, having been there
20 years, & an effect more in one word than he
witness is in twenty, because he is more respected
in the Market than the witness. Does not believe
Mr. Leprohon to be honest than he is. Mr.
Leprohon can not collect more than he does for he
collects all that is due on the Market. Witness
pays the man by whom he is assisted in his duties
on the Market. He receives 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ per day. Mr. Leprohon
on days other than the Market dues takes the money
to

to his own house,
