

## Report

To His Worship the Mayor, the Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Montreal,

The Finance Committee respectfully report.

On the accompanying letter of H. J. Joly Esquire, President of the Council of Agriculture of the Province of Quebec intimating that the Council have decided to erect permanent buildings in this City for holding every second year as heretofore the Provincial and Industrial Exhibitions, and asking for aid from the Corporation to carry out the project.

That at a recent meeting of Your Committee, H. J. Joly and Louis Beaubien, Esquires, Members of the Council of Agriculture, appeared before them and explained the views of the Council on the subject; they said in substance it was proposed to acquire for this purpose from 20 to 30 arpents of land from the Government at the end of Dorchester Avenue or from the ruins of the Hotel Dieu on Mount Royal Avenue; to lay out the ground into a Park, Plant trees thereon and leave the same open

Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> June 1870.

open to the public, if deemed expedient, when not occupied for exhibitions; to surround the grounds with a large avenue to be ornamented with trees; to erect good and substantial Buildings for exhibition purposes superior to those in use in the Province of Ontario and of sufficient size to afford the space necessary for placing the productions of the Arts and Manufactures as well as the Agricultural, Horticultural and Mineral productions of the Dominion, and a strong and sufficient fence all around the lot purchased. Messrs Joly & Beaubien further said they thought there would be no difficulty in having two or three members of the City Council placed on the Building Committee.

After mature consideration of the subject and in view of the many advantages that the City of Montreal will undoubtedly derive by securing the permanent establishment here of Provincial Exhibitions, your Committee came to the conclusion it is expedient and proper the City Council of Montreal should favor the proposition now made to them, which, it is true, will entail an annual expenditure of \$2000, out of the City Funds until the Bonds are matured; but as the City Council, under the former arrangement, is called upon to contribute every two years a sum of \$4000 for these exhibitions, it is apparent that no new charge will be made in the City Revenue, by adopting the suggestion now made.

They therefore recommend to the Council to grant a sum of \$20,000 for that purpose, subject to the following conditions; viz:

1<sup>st</sup> The proposed grant to be covered by a loan for which authority will be asked from the Provincial Legislature at its next session, the said loan to be payable in 25 Years with interest at the rate of six per cent and two per cent per annum, additional of a sinking fund to redeem the debentures at maturity, the Corporation reserving to themselves the alternative either to hand over the Bonds to the said Council of Agriculture or to pay them in money the net proceeds of the sale of the said Bonds, which amount shall be expended

expended under the directions of the joint Committee hereinafter provided—

2<sup>o</sup> The property selected and upon which the said grant will be expended, shall be unencumbered and shall at all times be kept clear from any mortgage or encumbrance whatsoever, excepting that of the Corporation, as hereinafter provided.

3<sup>o</sup> The grounds and buildings to be erected and for which the present grant is made, shall at all times to come, be the grounds and Buildings used for the purposes for which they are established, viz: for the Provincial, Agricultural and Industrial Exhibitions of the products of agriculture, Horticulture, arts and manufactures and minerals as aforesaid.

4<sup>o</sup> Should the Council of Agriculture, or their successors, at any time hereafter cease to use the said grounds and buildings for the purposes aforesaid or convert the same to other purposes without the previous sanction of the City Council, and thus deprive this City of the advantages secured by the present arrangement, the Corporation in that case shall be entitled to get back from the Council of Agriculture, the amount of the said grant, viz \$25,000.00 and for the purpose of securing the payment of the said sum, the Corporation shall have a special mortgage and prior claim upon the land and property acquired for the foregoing purposes and upon which the said amount shall be expended.

5<sup>o</sup> A joint Committee shall be appointed, consisting of four Members of the Council of Agriculture and three Members of the City Council, a majority of whom shall form a Quorum at meetings for transaction of Business, all of which meetings shall be held in Montreal. The said joint Committee shall have the management and control of the expenditure of the said money on the said grounds, the enclosing, laying out and keeping of the same, the preparation of Plans and construction of the Buildings to be erected thereon and also determine what use may be made of the whole property

### Report.

To His Worship the Mayor, the Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Montreal,

The City Hall Committee respectfully Report:

That for the past few years, complaints have been made to Your Committee on several occasions by the different Heads of Departments, concerning the bad state of the gas pipes in their different Offices.

These Pipes, which are lead, have now been laid for several years and are in a very bad and dangerous condition, allowing the gas to escape in great quantities, thereby entailing considerable cost for such waste.

Your Committee have, for the last few months, endeavoured to suppress this cause of complaint by putting on additional Meters, allowing the gas to be turned off when not absolutely required, but the leakage still continues, when the gas is turned on, and as this leakage is not only a source of serious loss but of considerable danger, Your Committee are of opinion that it would be advisable to take up the present lead pipes throughout the whole Building and to replace them with good substantial Iron ones.

As however there are not now sufficient funds at the disposal of Your Committee to meet such an expenditure, they recommend that they be authorised to sell by public Auction all the old waste furniture, effects and materials of every description, which are now stowed away in the different lumber Rooms of the City Hall and that they be allowed to appropriate the amount realised from this source, to the laying of a new Iron gas pipe as aforesaid.
