

That at the time of the granting of the appropriations for the current civic year, the sum of \$100,000 was placed at their disposal to carry on during the present year the various works under the control of their department out of which sum, large amounts were set apart for the payment of debts contracted during the past year, for the salaries of the staff of the Department and over \$10,000 for the new city hall, thereby virtually reducing the actual available amount at their disposal to about \$55,000, a sum altogether inadequate and

and insufficient for the great wants and requirements of so rapidly increasing a city as the city of Montreal.

Your Committee are happy to be able to state that notwithstanding the smallness of the amount granted to them to keep the streets of the city and footpaths in good condition, a very large amount of work has been done this year, and the streets of the City, it must be admitted, have been comparatively kept in good order.

Your Committee however, wish to inform you that notwithstanding the greatest care, vigilance and economy in its outlay, their appropriation is nearly exhausted and that it will be necessary to grant them a supplementary appropriation of \$10,000 to complete certain works already commenced and more particularly to enable them to construct footpaths in front of properties recently built upon and others where such footpaths are indispensably required as well as to macadamise certain streets or portions of streets which it would be unwise, and dangerous to allow to remain in their present condition.

A large amount of money has been spent in the construction of shafts and branches for which no provisions whatever were made in the granting of the appropriations, these shafts being altogether indispensable in order to save the city from heavy damages which they might otherwise have been called upon to pay out there are still a very large number of places wherein shafts might very advantageously be constructed. The amount spent in cleaning and repairing sewers far exceeds the sum appropriated for such purposes, the drains alone in Common and St Lawrence Main streets nearly absorbing the whole of the appropriation.

Wherefore your Committee recommend that an appropriation of \$10,000 be placed at their disposal to complete for the season the works of their Department.

To His Worship the Mayor, the Aldermen and

The Road Committee respectfully report:
That for many years past, the streets of this city, in the great majority of cases, have been macadamised with the soft limestone taken from the Reservoir Grounds at the Mountain and your Committee, having fully tested the power of endurance and durability of this stone, are unanimous in the opinion that it is highly desirable to discontinue the practice heretofore followed of macadamising the streets with soft limestone and that steps should be immediately taken to obtain in its stead a sufficient supply of Banc-Rouge stone.

The stone taken from the Reservoir, is a kind of soft limestone which, from the nature of our Climate, may particularly in streets subjected to any large amount of traffic,

Mondays 1st December 1868

is speedily ground into powder after it is spread, thereby in wet weather creating mud, and in dry weather, dust. Already on several occasions have the Corporation been obliged to spend large sums of money to repair sewers, shafts and branches which have been choked by mud from this source and it is next to impossible to keep the streets in a passable degree of cleanliness whilst these stones are spread thereon, added to which the clouds of dust caused by the pulverising of these stones, becomes betimes the source not only of serious annoyance and discomfort to the citizens but often of great injury to the trade.

Moreover the streets macadamised with this soft limestone require to be continually looked after and repaired and several streets which have received in the Spring of the year a coating six inches thick of this stone, had to be thoroughly renewed the following season, thus making the cost of this stone in the long run to be far above that of Banc-Rouge stone, the primitive cost of which, owing to its hardness and the consequent greater difficulties to be encountered in quarrying and breaking it, is much greater than that of the limestone, but streets properly formed with a good coating of Banc-Rouge stone will stand the heavier traffic for four years, requiring only trifling repairs.

Fully impressed with the importance of this subject and firmly convinced that it will ere long prove to be a large saving to the Corporation as well as beneficial in a sanitary point of view, Your Committee do earnestly recommend that it be Resolved by the Council to discontinue as gradually as circumstances will allow the macadamising with soft limestone of the streets wherein any considerable amount of traffic is carried on and the substitution in its place of Banc-Rouge stone and that in order that they may better be enabled to carry out these views, an appropriation of \$25,000.00 be placed at their disposal for that purpose -
