I have now settled

the colonial legislature & the bill

(the act)

out the first clause, and simply  
giving the power of suing & being  
sued by their Secretary - The bill

with it, I feel assured that it is  
a bona fide concern - and as the  
paraphrastic and objectionable  
has been struck out, the power of the  
company will surely be confined  
to the purposes of the original Colonial  
act. - Richard Inman is the brother

of Bro. Ward Norman, and is the intimate  
friend of Mrs. Lloyd & Bro. & Carrie.  
I have known him many years, &  
he is wholly unconnected with Wehfield,  
and such of a fair commercial  
operations... hoping these proceedings

bound to say all this, as I believe  
it to be true to the letter, and as I  
have been the cause of their being
