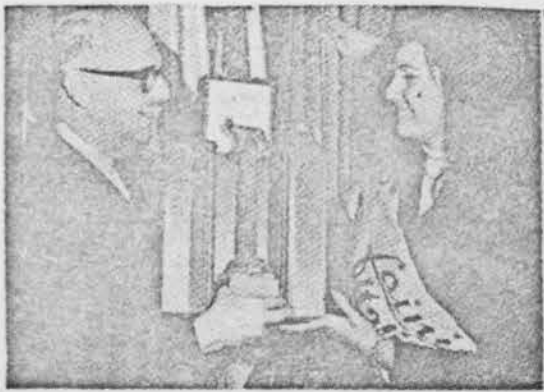

### ***Drapeau says grazie to graceful Grazia***

The shy Miss Italy 1968 wants to be a lawyer.

Grazia Chiapaloni, the 18-year-old daughter of a high school French teacher, expects to enter the University of Rome next year.

"I'll be a lawyer first and then get married," she said through an interpreter. She speaks neither English nor French.

"But not too many children. No more than one," insisted the girl with the dark complexion and the dreamed-of figure. Probably her four sisters and one brother at home in Palmi, Southern Italy, are enough for her.

Miss Chiapaloni has been on a three week tour of the U.S. modelling fashions for an Italian knitwear company.

Yesterday she was at City Hall to present Mayor Drapeau with an oxidized bronze statue of the she-wolf which weaned Romulus and Remus. It was a gift from the Mayor of Rome in return for the Montreal mayor's visit to the Italian capital a month ago.

Accepting the foot high bronze, Mayor Drapeau declined to give Miss Chiapaloni the usual "thank you" kiss.

"I don't think I should steal Mr. Trudeau's gambits," he quipped.
