

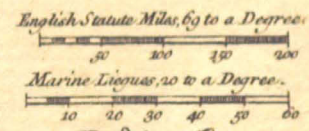


By the Treaty of Utrecht, the French have the Liberty of the Northern Coast of Newfoundland, from C. Rich to Cork Bay; for Curing their Fish only.

By the above Treaty, the North Limits of Canada is bounded by a Line drawn from Davis's Inlet in the Western Ocean to the Lakes Mistassin & Abitibi, and from thence by the Parallel of 49 Degrees to the South Sea.

The Southern Boundary of D^s is from the Mouth of St. Lawrence River to Montreal, from thence by a Compass round, through the Great Lakes to the River Mississippi, where it terminates in 41 Deg^s of Latitude.
