GENTLEMEN,-

As the City did not keep the winter roads open to the Restaurant during last year although a Resolution has been passed by your Committee on the 24th. of October 1895 upon application then made to you to close the Restaurant during the winter months upon a proportionate reduction of rent, the City not to be bound to keep the Roads clear to the Restaurant, it was resolved to defer consideration of same, the Superintendent in the meantime being instructed to keep the Restaurant roads clear to the same width as the main Park road. Notwithstanding this Resolution of your Committee the roads were not kept open during last year.

I therefore hereby offer for this year only to close the Restaurant from November 20th., till April 20th., 1897 and will hereby renounce, for this year only, to the clause in my Contract obliging the City to keep the winter roads open to the Restaurant in as good a condition as possible on the following conditions, to wit,-

FIRST,- That the City will keep the snow off the
Roof of the Restaurant, the Sheds and the Stables
connected

connected therewith, ~~and otherwise protect the said Buildings~~
~~from injury or damage.~~

SECOND,- That the City will allow me the rent from
the 20th. of November to the 20th. of April, this
reduction being asked as it will cost me more
than that to provide a house and stables for
the winter months.

Hoping you will consider this offer in the interests
of THE CITY as it will save the said City a large amount of
money.

Gentlemen

The **petition** of the undersigned Proprietors in the vicinity of Esplanade Avenue and Upper St. Urbain Street respectfully sheweth:

That

The approach to **Mount Royal Park** for a large number of citizens lies between Mount Royal Avenue and Duluth Avenue.

That whereas

Large sums of money have been expended on the adornment and improvement of the Mountain portion of the Park, very little has been laid out on the lower portion lying between Park Avenue and the eastern extremity of the Park.

That

The improvement of this Section of the Park is even more requisite than the upper portion, inasmuch as it is the only part that can be reached by a large number of people, including those who are feeble and decrepit, as well as young children and infants.

That

At present the Eastern side of the Park presents an unfinished and neglected appearance.

That

The Park Commissioners at their meeting held on the 31st July 1890, unanimously recommended the opening of Esplanade Avenue as being in the interest of the Public generally; the Proprietors fronting on the Park giving up all their rights in the 20 foot Lane forming the boundary thereof, and the City ceding, on its part, from Mount Royal Park the Balance of Land required to form an Avenue of Sixty - six feet in width.

That

the said Report was adopted at a meeting of the City Council held on the 29th December 1890.

That whereas

For the reason that some Question arose as to the right of the Proprietors to cede the Lane opposite their respective properties to the City, no action has yet been taken towards opening the said Esplanade Avenue, to the great detriment of the proprietors in the neighbourhood as well as to the appearance of the Park and the public interest generally,

That

whatever question there may be in regard to the 20 foot lane, above referred to, there can be none as to the ownership of the Park by the City

Wherefore

Your Petitioners would humbly pray that the Fence marking

The limit of the Park be placed at once on the line of the 46 feet ceded by the City for the purpose of forming Esplanade Avenue, and that a space of 25 feet from the line in question be graded for the purpose of forming a Roadway.

as the cost of the above would be very small indeed, and as the benefits to be derived in the way of increased facilities for access and an improvement in the appearance of the Park and the neighbourhood generally, your Petitioners would beg that orders be given to carry out the work with the least possible delay.
