

I the undersigned Treasurer of the City of Montreal do hereby certify that I have faithfully fulfilled the obligation imposed upon me by the 1st Section of the Act 16 to Chaptr 26 Intituled "an Act to Authorize the City of Montreal to raise a Loan to Consolidate their Debt" - and of the Act ~~34.~~ ^{14.} 1st 25th Sections of the Act ~~19~~ ¹⁰ Vict: Chapter 50 Intituled "An Act to Amend the Provisions of several Acts relating to the City of Montreal"; and that in conformity with the provisions thereof, I have this year taken out of the annual revenues and funds of the Corporation of the Said City of Montreal (from whatever source arising), and before the payment of any appropriations whatever of the said revenues or funds, the sum of Thirty nine thousand Seven hundred and Twenty two Dollars (\$39722⁰⁰) which said sum is equal to two per cent on the outstanding Consolidated Debt of the City - secured otherwise than by Bonds for terminable annuities - which said sum of money, I have and do still keep apart, from all other moneys to be invested and applied under the orders of the said Board, solely and exclusively as a Sinking Fund towards the extinction of that portion of the said Consolidated Debt, secured otherwise than by Bonds for terminable annuities - In testimony whereof I have hereunto signed, and this Certificate hath been countersigned by the Mayor of the Said City of Montreal, in the City Hall of the Said City - this Eleventh day of September 1866.
