N. English Favored For Council Seat

Norman English, prominent Montreal businessman, was mentioned at City Hall today as probable future incumbent of the city council seat left vacant by the recent death of Councillor J. J. Creelman.

Councillor Creelman was one of three delegates in council of the Montreal Citizens' Committee. Since he was a class C representative (one of 33 non-elective delegates of 13 local public bodies) the new incumbent must be approved by the category before taking his seat.

Mr. English, said one City Hall authority, was a keen follower of local municipal affairs. When city council meets tomorrow, class B representatives will also be taking a caucus vote on a replacement for Councillor Marcel Verville, who died June 26.

Quebec Gives \$1,000 To Mechanics' Institute

The Quebec provincial government has made a grant of \$1,000 to Montreal's Mechanics' Institute.

E. A. Thorne, retiring from the presidency of the institute after seven years in office, revealed the grant at the annual meeting of the institute yesterday.

He said the money would be used for the future work of the library.

Norman English was elected president.

Mr. Thorne told the members that there had been increased activity in every department during the past year. Capacity audiences had attended the film showings and there was increased interest in the music appreciation concerts and medical forums, held weekly during the winter season and open to the public free-of-charge.

Librarian Sybil Grimson reported an increase in membership from all parts of the city and suburbs of 8.4 per cent. There were now 55,298 books in the library, she said. The books in the circulating library included the current best sellers in fiction and non-fiction as well as books on many varying subjects. The reference and reading rooms were used for study by over 12,000 people during the year.

"The theme for Canadian Library Week is 'Reading Is the Key' and a glance at the titles most frequently circulated shows that it is the key

to knowledge. But also to adventure and escape," said Miss Grimson.
