

Extract from a Report of a Committee of the
Honorable the Executive Council on **LAND**
APPLICATIONS, dated the 1st October 1845
approved by His Excellency the Governor
General in Council on the 3 October 1845

On the Petition of the Mic-Mac Indians
of Ristigouche for a Grant of Land *Yes*

The Committee without being furnished
with information respecting the extent of land held
by the Crown in the Neighbourhood of Ristigouche,
are unable to advise Your Excellency on the subject
of the Application in favour of the Mic-Mac
Indians who inhabit that locality. But if the
Government is still possessed of sufficient land
for the purpose, the Committee see no reason for
withholding from that Tribe of Indians, the use
of a tract of land of ten or twelve Miles Square
as a Reserve from which they may supply
themselves with fuel. Should it be deemed
expedient by Your Excellency to bestow any
other indulgence on these Indians, the subject
may be submitted to the Legislature at the
next Session.
