Your Committee, having advertised for tenders for the artificers' works to be done to erect said station, have received tenders from the parties named in the annexed statement.

Your Committee recommend that the tender of Bourgouin & Cadien for the masonry, wood work, etc., at \$9897^{xx} and that of P. X. Breuer for the plumbing, gas piping & heating at \$970. be accepted as being the lowest and that an appropriation of \$11,200. including architect's fees be granted to your Committee for the erection of said building.

The Police Committee

Respectfully Report,

That, for some time past, they have had under consideration the advisability of establishing a new Fire and Police Station, on Chabotley Square, to replace the present one which is, in every respect, unfit for the purposes of a Fire and Police station, on account of its unhealthy condition.

That your Committee, after having given the matter their most careful attention, have come to the conclusion it is desirable that the Fire & Police stations be separated, the Fire station to be built on the present site and the Police station to be located in some suitable spot in the neighbourhood.

With that end in view, Your Committee have entered into arrangements with James McShane, Jr., for the acquisition of his property, known as lot N° 799 on the official plan and book of reference for St. Antoine Ward, fronting on Chabotley street and measuring about 40x49 superficial feet.

This property Mr. McShane is willing to cede for the sum of three thousand five

hundred

hundred (\$3500.) dollars.

Your Committee believe the terms offered are reasonable and the site well adapted for the purpose intended.

They accordingly recommend that they be authorized to acquire the said property for the purposes aforesaid and upon the terms specified.
