- 1844 Le Conseil municipal décide de construire au centre du square Chaboillez un poste destiné à abriter les appareils de pompage contre l'incendie dans le quartier St-Joseph.  
 Le Conseil vote une somme de £150 pour la construction de ce poste, lequel fut par la suite appelé: "Hero Engine House".
- 1854 26 avril. On demande d'établir à un autre endroit le poste ci-dessus que l'on considère comme une nuisance au centre du square.
- 1855 24 juillet. La Commission des Incendies recommande l'achat du terrain situé sur le côté ouest du square que M.Olivier Berthelet offre de vendre au prix de £ 250.  
 On décide de démolir le poste ci-dessus et de le reconstruire sur le terrain nouvellement acquis de M.Berthelet.
- 1857 27 mars. Au cours de la construction du nouveau poste on a utilisé comme mur mitoyen celui de la propriété voisine appartenant à M.Nicolas Métayer. La Ville vote un crédit de £25, payable à M.Métayer, pour l'acquisition du droit de mitoyenneté. Cette somme représente la moitié du coût de construction de ce mur par M.Métayer.
- 1858 On décide aussi de construire sur l'emplacement ci-dessus, acquis de M.Berthelet, une autre bâtisse pour servir de poste de police. Un crédit de \$1,200 est voté à cette fin.
- 1863 Agrandissement du poste de police. Crédit de \$700. pour l'extension du poste de police, à l'arrière de la maison.

take steps to cause the above complaints to cease, and  
have said Road repaired.

Respectfully Sheweth,

That in the year 1817 the  
late G. Portenais laid out his farm in the  
Quebec Suburbs in lots divided by a public  
Street of thirty six feet in width, with a space  
for a Public Market or Square in the front  
and afterwards disposed of several lots ~~to~~  
to individuals many of whom have since  
erected buildings thereon - That the street  
and square have been formed entirely at  
private expense and although some of  
your Petitioners have been paying assessment  
for their property in that street for upwards  
of twenty years yet no public money has  
been expended in forming and keeping it  
in repair. Your Petitioners therefore pray  
that your Worshipful Body will take  
possession of the Road & Square for the benefit  
of the City and direct the necessary repairs  
to be made so as to render it passable at all  
seasons of the year -

That as directed by the Council they have considered the accompanying Report of the Finance Committee for an appropriation of £ 25 to pay Mr Nicolas Metayer for the mitoyennité of his wall, used as a division wall in the Re-building of the Hero Engine House; and although satisfied that Mr Metayer must be paid the amount specified, they are not of opinion that any appropriation is necessary for the purpose - Their reasons for coming to this conclusion are as follows - In the first instance the Council appropriated the sum of £150 by to rebuild the Hero Engine House. Subsequently the contractor agreed to remove the old Engine House, and rebuild the new one on its present site for the sum of £145 by. According to the plans and specifications the Contractor was bound to erect four walls, in the rebuilding of the Engine House, but in consequence of the use made of Mr Metayer's wall, he only constructed three walls to the New Building. It is therefore obvious that Metayer should be paid the price charged for the mitoyennité of his wall by the
