Dear Sir

In fulfilment of the promise contained in my letter of the 8th Ult. I brought the matter of the appropriation of a lot in the Cemetery for the interment of members of the Fire Department, who may lose their lives in the discharge of their duty - before the Trustees at their first meeting for the despatch of business, since their election, held yesterday.

The Superintendent, being present stated that the Chief and some members of the Fire Department, had visited the Cemetery, and had made choice of a spot in section G. which they would prefer for the interment of their deceased comrades, whereupon it was

Resolved, That the Superintendent do set apart a lot of five hundred (500) superficial feet, free of all charges.

"in the spot selected in Section G. of
"the Cemetery, and that the same be
"duly conveyed to the "Firemen's Benevolent
"Association" of Montreal, a body corporate
"and politic, to be for ever appropriated
"to the interment of the remains of Firemen
"who lose their lives in the performance
"of their duty."

Your esteemed favour of the 17th
April, was also read, and ordered to be filed
among the records of the Corporation.
