Certificate of Sinking Fund for 1887

To His Worship the Mayor Members of Council.

In conformity with the terms of the act of the legislature 37 Victoria, Cap 51, Sec 11 requiring me to "submit to the City Council, annually, a statement, under oath, shewing whether the Treasurer has or has not fulfilled the obligation imposed upon him by the said section to set aside a sum of money equal to one or two per cent. (as the case may be and according to the period fixed for the maturity of the said loans respectively) on the debt created by the sale of Bonds or Debentures issued under Class C. of the "City of Montreal Consolidated Fund," and to invest the sum so set apart as a Sinking Fund, with all interest accruing thereon, in public Securities or Bonds of the Government of Canada, or of the local Government of Quebec and not otherwise: I hereby declare that the City Treasurer has fulfilled the said obligation for the Civic year of 1887 by the purchase of public Securities of the value of \$28,447 which, together with the amounts previously acquired, is reserved for that purpose and fully covers the amount called for by the issue to date as shown by the following Statement.

Gentlemen,

The difficulties encountered by our department in dealing with nuisances, frequently of a grave character, on properties the owners of which are absent from the city, compelled me to represent to your Board, at the meeting held on the 12th of August, 1887, the urgent necessity of amending By-Law No. 105 in such a manner as to facilitate legal measures in such cases. The result of my representations was that after consultation with the City Attorney, it was resolved ^{on the 2nd September/87} that a report should be made to Council strongly recommending the adoption of such an amendment, as early as possible. In accordance with the terms of the said resolution, a report was duly transmitted to Council, but no action has so far been taken on the same, and the department still remains unable to properly deal with the cases in question, and public health has to suffer in consequence. I would therefore respectfully suggest that another report be made to Council requesting that action be taken in the matter, without further delay.

By-Law to amend By-Law No. 107 to regulate the construction of build- ings and prevent accidents by fire.

At a meeting &c.

J.R.
IT is ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of
Montreal, as follows :

Sec. 1.—Section 40 of By-law No. 107 passed by the
said Council on the sixth day of April 1877 and intituled :
“ *By-law to regulate the construction of buildings and prevent
accidents by fire* ” is amended by striking out the words
“ *with one side at least of such structure entirely and constantly
open* ” at the end thereof and replacing them by the follow-
ing words “ *with one of the longest sides of such structure
entirely and constantly open, such open side to be eight feet at
least distant from any other building* ”

Sec. 2.—Section 67 of the said By-law No. 107 is
repealed and the following substituted in its stead :

“ Sec. 67.—The following rules shall be observed as
regards the manufactures, sale or storage of inflammable
liquids in the City :

1. No person shall manufacture, sell or store petro-
leum, naphtha, kerosene, coal oil, varnish, turpentine or
alcohol in any other but a fire proof building, nor without
having previously applied for and obtained a license to
that effect from the said inspector ;

*crude
or refined*

2. The building in which any of the liquids aforesaid
is manufactured shall be provided with a furnace located

inside or underneath a properly constructed chimney to be raised feet at least above the apex of the roof of the surrounding buildings, within a radius of 150 feet from such factory ; it shall also be provided with fire proof doors and the openings for light and ventilation shall be in the roof with proper fittings ;

3. It shall not be lawful to keep or store any of the liquids aforesaid above the ground story of the building in which the same is kept or stored ; and proper precaution shall be taken to prevent the overflow of such liquid beyond the premises wherein it is kept or stored ;

4. In all cases where such liquids are kept for sale by retail, they shall be kept in metallic tanks or vessels to be approved of by the said inspector ;

5. No other but safety lamps shall be used in buildings where such liquids are manufactured or stored.

Extract from the minutes of a meeting held on the 2^d August 1888:

In answer to the communication from the Local Board of Verdun, this Board unhesitatingly resolves:

That the utmost care should be taken by every municipality in this Province to preserve the purity of the water & ice supplied to its inhabitants.

That cemeteries and large institutions, such as factories, Colleges, Convent Hospitals, Hotels & such like should not be permitted too near either the aqueducts, reservoirs or settling ponds supplying ^{said} municipalities, neither should the outfall of the drainage system be too near the intakes of the water supply.

Therefore the Provincial Board of Health
authorizes the local Bd of Health of Verdun
to immediately request the directors of the
proposed Lunatic Hospital about to be
established in their municipality, and at
a very great distance from the aqueduct
supplying Montreal with water, to furnish
the local Board with the plan of
the proposed buildings and grounds showing
the method of drainage & also the system
by which the fecal matters from the
inmates are to be disposed of.

2. The Chief to have full control of his men, including the right of dismissing them.
3. The Alarm boxes to be fitted with glass fronts, or a small box with glass front containing key to be attached to alarm box.
4. The whole apparatus of the Department including steam and chemical engines, and also Salvage Corps, to be placed and maintained in efficient working condition and the appliances to be increased if found necessary by the Chief.
5. A reserve call force, of at least 50 men, to be established outside the regular Brigade, for readiness in case of emergency.
6. Each hose distributing station to be furnished with proper means of testing and expeditiously drying hose.
7. That all steamers be supplied with heaters.

Suggestions,- That one pattern of steamers be adhered to. That systematic communication be established between the Fire and Water Departments by which the former shall be kept promptly posted on all changes in mains, hydrants, &c.
