1846 April 8. Mr. Papineau calls the
attention of the S. G. to the propriety
of making provision for the
Indian Tribes in L. C.; and
until the matter is more
minutely examined, that
the C. of C. L. sh^d be ordered
by order in Council to pay
over to the Receiver General
for that purpose a semi-
annual sum of \$500 &c
and that hereafter the
payment, or that which
may be hereafter thought
proper to be made, be made
a first charge on the
Crown Land Revenue"
