

Club owner Rufus Rockhead dies

Rufus Nathaniel Rockhead, who for 50 years ran one of Montreal's most exuberant nightspots, died yesterday in the Ste. Anne de Bellevue Veterans' Hospital.

The former owner of Rockhead's Paradise at St. Antoine and Mountain Sts. was secretive about his age, but friends of the family say he was 89.

Rockhead, a native of Jamaica, never celebrated his birthday, didn't smoke, didn't drink, and enjoyed life to the hilt.

His zest for living was so abundant that it spilled over into the nightclub that attracted celebrities from around the world — both on stage and in the audience.

But Rockhead also had a heart for the little guy, hiring men and women temporarily down on their

luck to fill non-existent jobs in the club.

He opened a tavern more than 50 years ago, when blacks weren't notably successful in obtaining liquor permits. No one knows how Rockhead cut through the red tape — or at least no one is telling.

It took Rockhead three years of seven-day work weeks to turn the tavern into a club that was a beacon of warmth in the midst of the depressed living and working conditions of the black ghetto.

The Paradise, as the sign blazed, was Rockhead's life — 18 hours a day, every day, and the mention of his taking a vacation brought a look of disdain. His club was his hobby and his holiday, and he tried to make the customers feel, if only for a few hours, that they too were worry-free.

Among the big names who played

Rockhead's were Oscar Peterson, Billie Holiday, Redd Foxx and Ella Fitzgerald. And others — such as Pearl Bailey and Louis Armstrong — would drop in just to have a good time.

In March of 1978, Rockhead suffered a massive stroke, and had been an invalid since.

The club was later sold to Douodu Boitel and is known as the Rising Sun.

Rockhead, whose wife Elizabeth died 19 years ago, is survived by his children Kenneth, Jacqueline (Mrs. D. Rapier of Toronto), Arvilia (Mrs. G. Ginyard of Los Angeles), his brother Byron, and grandchildren David, Jeffrey, Philip, Carolyn, Martin and Dean.

Budget cuts threaten mental health centre

Workers at the Maison St. Jacques mental health centre said yesterday they may have to shut their doors next month because of Quebec government budget cuts.

The 15 workers agreed in June to give up one weekly pay cheque of \$265 each month.

But yesterday they said they can't continue to cut their salaries by a quarter, and will close the St. Hubert St. centre if the social affairs department does not reverse its decision to cut their budget.

Quebec cut the Maison St. Jacques' budget from \$256,000 last year to \$215,000 this year. The workers estimate they need at least \$307,000 this year to keep their doors open.

But Social Affairs Minister Pierre Marc Johnson said in a statement that the workers must live with the budget restrictions.

Maison St. Jacques offers mental

health therapy to about 125 patients aged 18 to 30 each year. They are referred to the centre by hospitals and social workers.

Official Daniel Cossette said that despite belt-tightening efforts — such as giving up a secretary, postponing urgent renovations and eliminating summer and winter camps for patients — the centre has a \$15,000 deficit.

"We consider our situation every week to see if we can hold on to our jobs," Cossette said. "We can't survive much longer."

The workers said the centre's patients cost the Quebec government \$55 per day, about \$200 less than in hospitals.

The workers said the centre's services are essential to hundreds of youths in the surrounding area who would otherwise end up in psychiatric centres.




