Robert Rogers

Montreal 10th April 1769

Sir

I have about one hundred packs
of beaver & peltrys at Lake la plue, that was
left there last summer, and stored, as my con-
finement prevented me to send the men who
had them in charge provisions to bring them in,

These furs are valuable and
almost the bulk of my fortune, therefore I beg
of your Excellency to grant me your pass for
one Cannoe loaded with provisions and eight
men to work her, to go directly from this place
to Lake la plue and bring in my furs to
Mishilimakinac, for should the Cannoe that
I propose to send be obliged to touch at Mish-
ilimakinac without ~~reserve~~, instead of going
Directly into Lake Superior it will take them
at least fifteen days longer time by which
means the people that has my furs in charge
may be under necessity, for want of provisions
to eat the peltrys, there is Gentlemen here that
will ^{give} the necessary security for the men to whom
soever your Excellency Directs to receive it
your Compliance in forwarding
me the pass by the return of the post will much
oblidge


