Sessions, of the peace in the
City & District of Montreal.

The petition, of all the constables Belonging
to said Court.

Most Humbly Sheweth.

That your petitioners, are officers of and appoin-
ted by your worships, to the said office, and
are alwilling and ready, to execute, all your wors-
hips orders from time, to time serve all the war-
rants, and summons, that shall be, or may
hereafter be, issued out of the Clerks office, and do
all the duties, that shall be required of them.

That your petitioners, wish further
to represent to your worships, that it is, and
hath been customary in this city for the
Bailiffs of His Majestys Courts of Kings Bench
to execute neygh all the warrants & summons

Warrants hath been issued from the Courts office, to the great damage of us constables, who are obliged to attend all the General Sessions, four times in one year, and the Honourable Court of Kings Bench two times in every year without pay or reward, which the Bailliffs are paid handsomely every day for their attendance in the Court above.

Therefore we the said constables, most humbly pray that your worshipps will please make an order, that all the warrants, may be directed to the High Constable, and all other Constables only, for the City and Baillie of Montreal, and that the same may be executed by them and them only hereafter.

Wherefore your petitioners, humbly prays that your worshipps will be pleased to take there request into consideration and do there on as in your worshipps wisdom may seem most meet and in duty bound will ever
