SIR,

By order of the Court of General Quarter Sessions, We beg to inform you, that there will be a General Meeting of the Magistrates, at their Room, in the Court House, in this City, on MONDAY next, the 28th day of October instant, at the hour of NINE, A. M. PRECISELY—for the dispatch of general business, and more especially to take into consideration a Communication received from T. A. Young Esquire, J. P. Inspector and Superintendent of Police of this City, bearing date on the 24th instant, calling the attention of the Magistrates to the objectionable nature of the Performances lately had at the Theatre, in this City, particularly that of the Evening of the 23d instant,—and stating, that if some measures be not adopted to prevent such Performances, and the consequent congregating of crowds of persons at the City Gates, Major General McDonell has stated, that however unwilling to put the Inhabitants of this City to inconvenience, he will be under the necessity of ordering all the City Gates to be closed, at an early hour, and to prevent any ingress or egress during the night.—Which Session you are requested to attend.
