MONTREAL RELIEF COMMITTEE.

The final meeting of this committee was held in the Board of Trade Rooms, Montreal, on Tuesday, the 9th August, 1892, at 3.30 o'clock, at which Mr. George Hague, occupied the chair. The following reports were submitted, approved and ordered to be printed, after which the meeting was adjourned sine die.

REPORT OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

Intelligence of the disastrous conflagration which well nigh obliterated the city of St. John's, Newfoundland, first reached Montreal on the morning of Saturday 9th July, and the detailed reports in the daily newspapers were of so alarming a character that an emergent meeting of the Council of the Board of Trade was called for noon of that day to consider what steps should be taken under the circumstances.

At that meeting, after deliberation, the Council authorized, as a preliminary step, the despatch of the following telegram to the St. John's Chamber of Commerce, and thereafter adjourned until Monday, 11th July:—

"Council Montreal Board of Trade sincerely sympathizes with your City;—will you suggest how Montreal can best aid you. Brief particulars of disaster desirable."

On Sunday, 10th July, the Secretary of the Board of Trade received the following reply from Sir Robert Thorburn, Vice-President of the St. John's Chamber of Commerce, which was communicated to the newspapers and laid before the adjourned meeting of Council on Monday, 11th July:—

"Grateful thanks for kind spmpathy; two-thirds of the City burnt, including mercantile premises, Churches and Schools. Foodstuffs, such as flour, pork, beef, butter and canned stuffs, most required for homeless poor; sufficient supplies for a fortnight presently available."

When the Council re-assembled on Monday, it was determined (1) to arrange for a deputation from the Board of Trade to wait upon the City Council at its regular meeting that day to urge the propriety and importance of a liberal grant being made from the civic treasury in aid of these suffering fellow-colonists; and (2) to requisition the Mayor to call a public meeting of citizens at the rooms of the Board for the next day, Tuesday 12th July, at noon.

The deputation accordingly waited on the City Council, read Sir Robert Thorburn's telegram, and urged the special and peculiar claims of Newfoundland for liberal aid in the direction indicated. The deputation was most cordially received by the Mayor and Aldermen, the request was approved and a resolution authorizing the Civic Finance Committee to make such a grant in aid of the St. John's sufferers was passed unanimously. The amount of the grant was subsequently fixed by the Finance Committee at \$10,000, and, having been ratified by the City Council, was duly paid to the Treasurer of this Committee.

The Mayor, having approved of the above mentioned requisition, called a public meeting of citizens at the rooms of the Board of Trade, on Tuesday, 12th July, at noon, which was numerously attended by influential citizens. The Mayor having been called to the Chair, the following resolutions were moved, spoken to and passed:—

"That the citizens of Montreal in public meeting assembled desire to tender to the city of St. John's, Newfoundland, fellow colonists of the same great Empire, their great sorrow at the terrible calamity which has befallen them in the destruction of a large portion of their beautiful city, and they trust that the great misfortune may be lightened to them by the sympathy and substantial assistance of the world.

"That a subscription be now opened for the providing of necessary relief for the sufferers by the recent disastrous fire in St. John's, Newfoundland, and that the collection, management and expenditure of the amounts subscribed, now and hereafter, be placed in the hands of the following committee, of which Mr. Richard White shall be secretary-treasurer. [See page 3 for names.]

The following resolution was also adopted:

"That this meeting of citizens considers that, in view of the great distress consequent upon the fire at St. John's Nfld., the city of Montreal in its corporate capacity should make a contribution towards the relief of the suffers by that calamity."

After the adjournment of the public meeting the above named committee met for organization when the following officers were appointed:—

Hon. James McShane, Mayor, Honorary Chairman. George Hague, Chairman, Chas. P. Hebert, Vice-Chairman.

A canvassing committee to secure subscriptions was named; also a purchasing committee to procure the supplies called for by Sir Robert Thorburn's message.

Advertisements were ordered to be inserted in the city and country newspapers appealing for aid either in money or in kind, to which numerous responses were subsequently received.

Spontaneous offers from the Railway and Express Companies of free freight from the West to Montreal, and from Messrs. H. & A. Allan of a free voyage of their Steamer "Newfoundland," from Montreal to St. John's, enabled the Committee to greatly increase the quantity of supplies purchasable with the money placed at their disposal, and to, in effect, lay down their foodstuffs in St. John's at the prices current in Western markets. For the better guidance of the Purchasing Committee in its work of selection the following telegram was despatched to Sir Robert Thorborn, the subscriptions in hand and promised being sufficient to warrant the amount indicated, after which the meeting was adjourned:—

"Committee in position to send supplies, please intimate definitely what you want and specify quantities for immediate shipment, say to the extent of Twenty thousand dollars."

The Committee held various meetings thereafter, but did not receive a communication from St. John's until Friday, 15th July, which it became apparent that the telegram of 12th July had somehow miscarried. The telegram then received was signed by Mr. Justice Little, President of Relief Committee, and was as follows:

"We have not recived your thoughtful and kind message, but assistance sent will be gratefully received. Pecuniary aid preferred; clothing much needed, also bedding."

It was therefore resolved to cable a remittance of £1000 sterling in cash to the St. John's Committee; and to authorize, out of the \$20,000 already voted, an expenditure of \$5000 in clothing and

bedding, which amount was subsequently, on the recommendation of the Purchasing Committee, increased to \$7000.

In response to a written request as to what the St. John's Relief Committee would prefer that the balance of the amount collected should be expended in, the following telegram was on 20th July received from the President of that Committee:

"Yours fifteenth received; most gratifying; sincerely grateful to your generous citizens. We have 9940 sufferers to shelter. Obliged largely from England. Please remit us all the cash you can. Cargo per 'Newfoundland' welcome."

It having been found cumbersome to call frequent meetings of the full committee, it was determined to organize an Executive Committee with Mr. Chas. P. Hébert as Chairman, Mr. Richard White, as Treasurer, and Mr. Geo. Hadrill, as Secretary, with full powers to conclude the business, making a final report to the general Committee and the public, it being understood that a cash remittance of the balance remaining after the steamer "Newfoundland" has been loaded, estimated at about five thousand dollars, should be made to St. John's, and the accounts thereby closed. Subsequently the St. John's Committee's draft on the Chairman for \$5000 was accepted and paid, as shown by the Treasurer's statement.

The lading of the steamer was completed on Saturday 30th July, and she proceeded on her voyage at daylight of the next day (Sunday 31st July) bearing with her cargo the following letter:—

To the President and Members of the Relief Committee, St. John's, Nfid. :

Gentlemen,—On behalf of the citizens of Montreal we have pleasure in asking your kind offices in the distribution among the sufferers by the late fire in your city of the provisions, clothing bedding, etc., which will be landed with this from the Allan steamer "Newfoundland". The Relief Committee here has been guided in the selection of its contributions by the cablegrams received from Sir Robert Thorburn and other gentlemen, indicating that foodstuffs, clothing, etc., were much wanted. The liberality of the Grand Trunk and Canadian Pacific Railways, the Dominion and the Canadian Express Companies, and the Messrs. H. & A. Allan, in affording the Committee free transport for the supplies, has, in the opinion of the Committee, been the means of swelling very considerably the quantity of supplies that it has been able to forward.

We have already been notified of the receipt by your Committee of the sum of one thousand pounds sterling in cash sent from this committee, and we have no doubt but that we shall, so soon as the accounts, in connection with the present shipment are closed, be enabled to contribute a further sum in cash, of which you will have due notice.

The collection and warehousing of the contributions has been undertaken by Messrs. James A. Cantlie & Co., and Mr. James Williamson, while the shipping of the relief cargo on board the steamship Newfoundland has been attended to by Messrs. J. & R. McLea, who will advise you more particularly as to the details thereof.

Assuring you of the kindliest sympathy of the people of Montreal with their fellow-colonists in Newfoundland, and wishing you a speedy delivery from the great trials you are now experiencing,

The vessel arrived safely at St. John's on Friday, August 5th, and delivered her cargo to the Relief Committee.

GENTLEMEN,



The Receipts in cash amount to \$32,011.11, and in kind to \$7,549.87, making a total of \$39,560.98. The disbursements up to to-day are \$38,807.33, leaving balance on hand of \$753.65. There are still some accounts for printing and advertising to be paid, and it is possible some further contributions may yet come to hand. I would respectfully suggest that the sub-committee named to prepare the report be requested to continue to act as an executive, to finally close up the accounts, and remit any balance that may remain to the committee at St. John's.
