

U. E. Claimants.

In 1789. the first order in Council under the Administration of Lord Dorchester appropriated 200 acres of Land to the Sons & Daughters of Loyalists who joined the Royal Standard in America before the Treaty of Separation in 1783 - either on their arriving at full age, or on their marriages. Providing they comply with the general regulations, & that no default in the due cultivation & improvement of the Lands already assigned to the head of the family of which they are members.

Militiamen

In 1820, Lands were granted to the Prov. Corps & Militiamen, under the Administration of Sir Peregrine Maitland, on condition of complying with the settlement duties. As specified in the order in Council of 1818. viz: 'No deed or grant could thereafter issue until a habitable house was erected on some part of the Land & five acres cleared & fenced on each 100 acres.'
